Mr van Ypersele will be introduced by Professor Jos Delbeke, former Director-General of the European Commission's Directorate-General for Climate Action, now Senior Adviser for Relations with the Florence European University Institute, and one of the driving forces behind the Paris agreement.

**Jean-Pascal van Ypersele de Strihou** holds a PhD in physics from the Université catholique de Louvain, following his research on the effect of global warming on the Antarctic sea ice at the National Center for Atmospheric Research (NCAR) in the United States.

Since 1993, he is a member of the Belgian Federal Council for Sustainable Development, and chairs its working group on Energy and Climate.

Mr van Ypersele de Strihou was very much involved in the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), for which he lead the redaction of part of the Third Assessment Report, Climate Change 2001. He was elected Vice-Chair of the IPCC from 2008 to 2015.

Before and after that, he took part as Scientific Advisor to most United Nations conferences on climate-related issues.

In January 2017, he was appointed by former Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon as one of the 15 eminent scientists to draft the Global Sustainable Development Report, due in 2019. The Report is a key component of the mechanism to follow up and review progress on the agreed 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the Sustainable Development Goals. It aims to strengthen the science-policy interface and provide a strong evidence-based instrument to support policymakers in promoting poverty eradication and sustainable development.

*He currently teaches Climatology and Environmental Sciences, and leads the Master's programme in Science and Management of the Environment at the Université catholique de Louvain.* 

His most recent books are « In het oog van de klimaatstorm » (2018, EPO) and "Une vie au coeur des turbulences climatiques" (2015, De Boeck).
